Trustees:

Several years ago the Foundation Board of Trustees voted to no longer have a standing Executive Committee, that an Executive Committee would be formed on an as needed basis should a need arise. The thought was that the Executive Committee at the time felt it was unnecessary to meet, only to go over what would be covered at the upcoming meeting. They felt having an Executive Committee meeting every time prior to a scheduled Board meeting was a waste of time.

We are asking you to submit any concerns or questions you have with this. Otherwise, we will accept a motion, second, and vote to maintain that an Executive Committee of the Foundation Board of Trustees be as follows:

An Executive Committee may be formed on an as needed basis. It will consist of the Board Chair, the college president, and three (3) to five (5) board members selected by the Board of Trustees or those Trustees who volunteer. Chair of the Board of Trustees will serve as the Chairperson of the Executive Committee. When the number of trustees exceed 20, the Chair may assign an additional 3-5 trustees as members of the Executive Committee.

Should you have questions or concerns, those will be addressed before any vote is finalized.

Mr. Cary Vaughn made the motion to maintain the Executive Committee as is. Mr. Thorne Barbour provided a second to the motion.
