

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ..... SCHOLARSHIPS

## What kind of scholarships are available at JSCC?

- There are several scholarships offered at JSCC. Visit the website at [www.jsc.edu/financial-aid](http://www.jsc.edu/financial-aid) to see applications, eligibility requirements, deadlines, and other helpful information.

## How will I be notified if I am awarded a JSCC scholarship?

- All recipients are notified by mail.
- If you are a high school senior, a copy of the letter will be sent to your high school so that the award can be announced at your graduation or awards banquet.

## How much of my tuition and fees does a scholarship cover?

- Scholarship amounts vary
- You will be notified of the amount on your Award Letter.
- If you are awarded a scholarship that will cover your tuition and fees, the amount will be equal to the amount of tuition for up to twelve credit hours, including the technology, activity, and access fees (up to twelve credit hours).
- No other fees will be covered.
- Out-of-state tuition charges are not covered
- Charges for RODP classes are not covered

## How do I apply for the Tennessee Lottery Scholarship?

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
